Maths

2. Greg is making bread. The recipe calls for 750g of flour. He has a 1.5kg bag of flour. As a fraction, how much of the bag will he need to use?
3. At the dog rescue centre there are 21 cages. Each cage contains 3 dogs. How many dogs are in the centre altogether?
4. In a competition Sue scored 6430 points and Jeff 7010. Pam scored exactly halfway between Sue's and Jeff's scores. How many did Pam score?
5. In every book there are 250 raffle tickets. Altogether 10 complete books are sold. How many raffle tickets are sold altogether?
6. Tariq spend £56 on trainers and £97 on a coat. How much does he spend altogether?
7. Straws come in boxes of 125. Mrs Bright buys 6 boxes for the Xmas party. How many straws does she get?
8. Seven apple pies are cut into eight equal pieces. Of these pieces, 37 are eaten. Write the amount of apple pies left as a mixed number.

Literacy

LO- To use apostrophes

As you know, there are two main uses of apostrophes in writing:

- 1) To stand for missing letters in contracted words (e.g. can't)
- 2) To show ownership. If the item belongs to one person, the apostrophe goes before the "s" (e.g. the man's coat). If it belongs to more than one person the apostrophe goes after the "s" (e.g. the girls' toilets).

Beware of putting apostrophes into plurals (e.g. pencil's), it is not necessary!
