**Maths** (L.O: To be able to solve maths word problems.)

1. Bob is four times as old as his son, Billy. Bob is 32. How old is Billy?
2. I think of a number. I take away 17 and I'm left with 13. What number was I thinking of?
3. The Jones family set off in their car on a 103 mile journey. After 57 miles they stop for a break. How much further have they still got to go?
4. A taxi can carry 4 passengers. How many taxis would be needed to transport 47 passengers?
5. Jane has 62 felt tip pens. Half of them have run out. How many of her felt tip pens are still working?
6. In the school hall there is a ratio of 3 girls for every 1 boy. There are 27 girls. How many boys are there?
7. Sammy the snail crawls 6cm every day. How far will he have travelled after 10 weeks?
8. Terry has £10. He shares it equally between his 4 grandchildren. How much does each grandchild receive?

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**Literacy** (L.O: To be able to improve simple sentences by adding a 'drop in'.)

A 'drop in' provides the reader with extra information about the subject of a sentence. For example: 'Eric walked home from school.' **becomes** 'Eric, with tears in his eyes, walked home from school.'
